- Can you play hands together
- Can you play legato, staccato, soft and loud
- When you play your pieces are they fluent
- Can you keep a nice even beat
- Can you control the balance of tone in each hand
- Can you understand basic theory note values, time signatures, key signatures, signs on the music
- How well do you understand the piece you are playing
- Can you use the sustaining pedal
